

## Sustainable Futures In Agriculture Schools Project

Following on from the success of this project schools within the Gecko CLaN region are being invited to participate in 2016. This project was been funded for two years and has proven to be very popular with the students. Two Benalla schools were involved incorporating 120 students. We have taken the students on three field days each to the National Environment in Thurgoona, Yarallah Lamb run by the Marriotts at Goomalibee and the Melbourne University at Dookie Robotic Dairy.

## **Fire Recovery**

The Gecko CLaN's commitment to assisting farmers and affected communities with fire recovery has continued throughout 2015.
